## **Author and Childhood Cancer Survivor Alesia Shute hosts Cocktail Party Benefit**

*June 24th fundraiser benefits The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia*

**Smithville, NJ. (June 14, 2010)** - If Alesia Shute chose to complain about the obstacles she has faced, she would certainly be entitled. Instead, however, she has taken her experiences and used them to help others. After first being diagnosed with cancer at the age of seven, Shute endured six major surgeries and several minor ones. The uncertainty, fear, and pain that she experienced could have made her selfishly guard the good fortune she now enjoys. However, Shute decided to spend her time giving back to other families in similar situations and those who helped her when she was most in need.

Even as a pediatric patient, Shute began volunteering to help other sick children, offering encouragement and comfort. Now, as a cancer-free adult, she has spent more than two decades raising funds and donating to the place where she was once a patient: The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

On Thursday, June 24th, Shute is inviting others to join her mission to help pediatric cancer patients through a cocktail party fundraising benefit held at the historic Smithville Inn. The \$25 donation will be used to purchase and deliver books to local hospitals and organizations. In addition, guests will have the opportunity to buy Shute's book, *Everything's Okay*, a memoir detailing how she came to understand and accept her disease as an adolescent and through adulthood.

"It's written for the Mom and Dad sitting in the waiting room," Shute says. But it's also written for other members of the patient's family and for the patients. "A lot of teens are reading it," says Shute. They identify with the stories she tells-not just of her struggles with cancer, but also of the efforts she made to hide her illness from friends so she wouldn't appear different.

Shute says she wrote the book because she realized she had a compelling story to tell, but she didn't want the sharing to end there. As a result, 100 percent of the profits from sales of her book are donated to The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

Named by Bizymoms.com as a MOMspiration, Shute says that *Everything's Okay* provides a perspective of hope that has always been a part of Shute's personality, a trait she credits with helping her thrive after her experience.

The cocktail party benefit, which will be held from 6-8:30 p.m., features a raffle with prizes and a special surprise. Wine, beer, and hors d'oeuvres will be served. A cash bar is available.
